The Opioid Crisis is an evolving drug epidemic that affects the health of individuals and the safety of our communities in Calvert County. To respond effectively to this challenge, Law Enforcement, public safety, public health, and behavior health need access to timely and accurate information. These stakeholders have important roles and their effective use of real-time data, to include fatal and nonfatal overdoses, can save lives and allow for tailored responses. This data can be used to identify trends in the community for rapid response efforts by public safety partnerships, public health, behavior health and prevention efforts.

Drug Overdoses

(Opioid Overdoses)

Over-prescribing of opioids and distribution of illegal drugs (Heroin, Fentanyl) has contributed to rising rates of opioid addiction and overdoses. In coordination with Law Enforcement Agencies and Health Care Providers, Sheriff Mike Evans is working to reduce the number of Drug Overdose Incidents in Calvert County while supporting treatment efforts to victims and family

Opioid Victim Information: In helping those, struggling with addiction, there has been an increase in outpatient treatment. The Calvert County Sheriff's Office SOLID Program continues to work with Health Officials to provide needed support for families and victims. We also now have a New Resource available within our County with the Calvert County Behavior Health Recovery Rapid Response Unit. Detention Center and its programs Improving Reentry for Adults with Co-occurring Substance Abuse and Mental Illness.







Xylazine remains a popular additive to Fentanyl and Heroin.
