Exciting Opportunities for Volunteers

The Chesapeake Beach Oyster Cultivation Society (CBOCS) plans to expand our oyster education program for elementary school students this year. This will happen with the arrival of additional CHESPAX led school field trips in the fall and several CBOCS led field trips for private and non-county schools during both the spring and fall.

WANTED – for the CHESPAX trips, two ovster-oriented individuals to monitor the activities. Trips are on school days from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

WANTED – for the CBOCS trips, eight individuals to cover oysters, water monitoring, flow monitoring and observation stations. Trips are on school days from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Middle and high school clubs will be participating in several environmental projects. The most interesting will be identification, mapping and labeling of all the native and invasive plant species along the trail.

WANTED – several environmentally oriented individuals, especially with interest or expertise in plants and trees. Events will be on Saturdays.

The CBOCS education committee is embarking on a program to design a smart board module identifying the "Treasures of a Tidal Marsh." The program will be used for classroom or personal computer education and will give students a basic understanding of the ecology of a tidal marsh prior to visiting the one at Fishing Creek.

WANTED - educators, environmentalists. nature lovers, trail walkers, gardeners, botanists, bird watchers, zoologists, marine biologists, computer programmers, photographers, editors and anyone interested in this exciting project. Work sessions are



scheduled for Saturday mornings at Town Hall and on the Railway Trail.

The 75,000 CBOCS ovsters are hibernating for the winter under the trail and at selected piers along the bay. A recent check showed that all cages were doing well, and we are expecting a high survival rate this spring.

a rate structure that is present in the Town's "Water and Sewer Policy Manual," which is very old and way too low to bring in adequate revenue to run the system. Since this has taken so long, at least three of the four quarters this fiscal year are being billed at this old and inadequate rate. We would all like for the rates to remain very low, but this is simply not practical. Stay tuned for further developments.

We would also like to remind property owners that we do not mail utility bills Utility Bill to tenants. It is the owner's responsibility to handle the guarterly bills in a manner so that the Town receives payment in a timely manner. Please contact Connie or Fran with any changes in mailing addresses. You may also sign up for ebilling by visiting our website at www.chesapeake-beach.md.us. Scroll down the home page to the section labeled "Pay Your Utility Bill Online" and click on the link. Follow the directions on the next screen using a temporary password. Please call Town Hall and ask for Fran if you have any questions or problems. She will be happy to help you get started. You will still receive a paper bill in the mail.

Please pay your bill by the due date noted on the bill to avoid penalty charges. The due date is always 30 days past the billing date. Please note that the billing date may vary, but the due date is always thirty days from the noted billing date.



Bay Restoration Fee Financial Hardship Exemption Available for Eligible Town Residents

On May 26, 2004, Senate Bill 320 was signed into law, creating the Bay Restoration Fund ("BRF"). The purpose of the bill was to create a dedicated fund financed by wastewater treatment plant users to be used to upgrade Maryland's wastewater treatment plants with enhanced nutrient removal (ENR) technology. On July 1, 2012, House Bill 446 increased the mandated BRF fee from \$2.50 per month to \$5.00 per month, and required that BRF fee billing authorities develop a financial hardship fee waiver plan for low income households.

Residents of the Town of Chesapeake Beach may apply directly to the Town for an exemption from the fee due to substantial financial hardship. Exemptions are valid for a one year period. Applicants may reapply annually.

Mail completed application along with all supporting documents to:

Eligibility: Proof of residency must be provided by supplying (1) A copy of applicant's photo identification, and (2) a copy of tax bill, current utility bill, or executed lease. To be eligible for the hardship exemption, you must meet at least two of the following conditions:

- Receive energy assistance subsidy. Confirmation on official letterhead is required.
- Receive public assistance supplemental security income (SSI) or food stamps. Confirmation on official letterhead is required.
- Receive veterans or social security disability benefits. Confirmation on official letterhead is required.
- Meet the income criteria established by the Maryland Department of Human Resources/Office of Home Energy Programs. A copy of the tax return you filed for the prior calendar year is required. ■


