Finances

- Reduction in the Town Tax rate
- Goal of providing enhanced services to residents such as free Town resident access to Town owned boat ramps
- \$1.9M in Debt paid off in FY18



Water Reclamation Treatment Plant

- 3.465M gallons of water reuse in plant operations



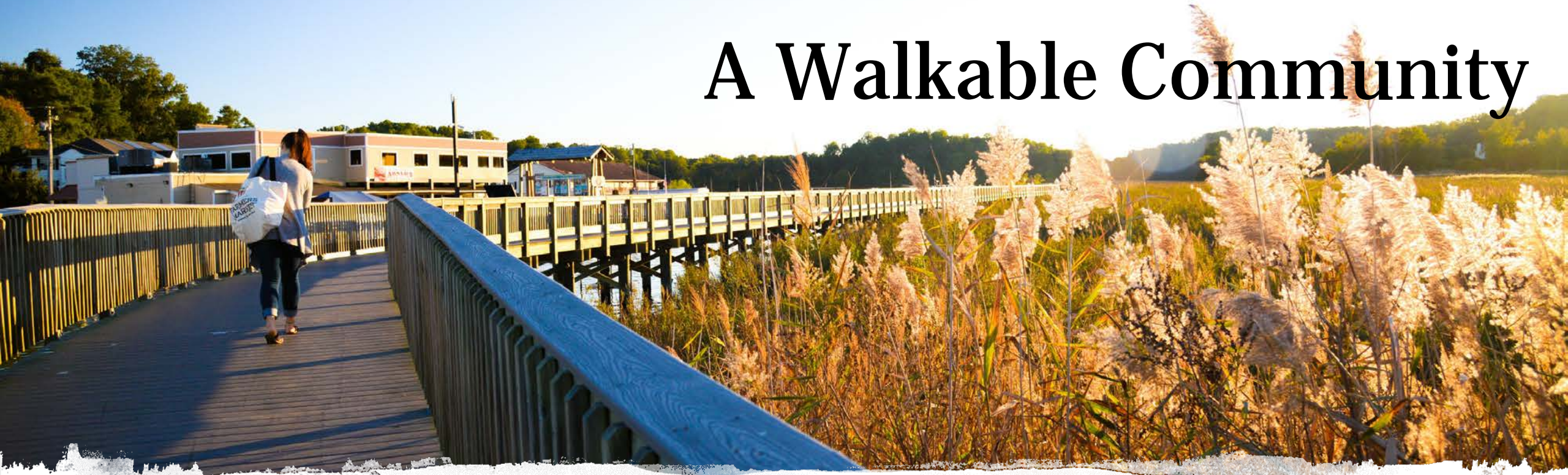
Safety

A Walkable Community



- Over 500 linear feet of sidewalk added in Commercial/Residential
- Safe Routes to School Design Phase is underway to include sidewalks from Beach Elementary to Chesapeake Village and along Old Bayside

Administrative

- Increased internal control measures
- \$1.36M Allocated by the Army Corp of Engineers in FY19, up by \$1.26M
- HUR funding up \$800,000 in the next 5 FY



Dredging

- Dredge Containment Facility Rehabilitation
- Preparation for the Federal Dredge



Town Assets

- Revenue from the Town owned Public Boat ramps remaining within the Town;
- Plans for improvement to the ramps



Water Park

- 5th largest employer in the County; employing 195 employees, 47% from Chesapeake Beach and 49% from Calvert County
- Improved longevity of the Park and decreased Down Time with infrastructure repairs
- Improved guest experience for over 42,000 guests the 2018 calendar year

Chesapeake Beach Oyster Cultivation Society CBOCS



- Hosted approximately 1,000 5th Graders from 8 Calvert County Elementary Schools measuring and counting oyster spat and monitoring water quality
- Sponsored 122 students in the painting of 300 sea life animals on a 4.5x16 foot mural
- 91.8% Survivability of 110,000 oysters moved to Old Rock Creek

OPIOID ABUSE AWARENESS

- Hosted 4 End Addiction Community Forums
- Removed approximately 5 pounds of prescription drugs from community households since January 2017
- Naloxone training to over 110 people
- Educated over 140 on Opioid Abuse “Hidden in Plain Sight” awareness
