THE SITUATION

- Opioid crisis engulfing nation and state. Opioids involved in 42,249 deaths in 2016, and opioid overdose deaths were 5x higher in 2016 than 1999, according to CDC.
- 2016 Chesapeake Beach: 18 overdoses, 2 deaths
- No one talking about the problem nor seemingly doing anything about it at the town level

- Limited staff resources
- Limited funding
- Limited substance abuse expertise



ACCOMPLISHMENTS & AWARD

PARTNERSHIPS ALLOWED US TO:

- Establish an overdose awareness road sign in town
- Train over 90 people in opioid overdose recovery (naloxone)
- Educate over 120 people on aspects of opioid use disorder & the opioid crisis via community forums
- Remove over 3 pounds of prescriptions drugs from community
- Facilitate Abner's Crab House joining drug free business program; Abner's will also be hosting a drug awareness fundraiser in fall 2018.
- Increase opioid crisis awareness of hundreds of residents via outreach events, social media, and articles
- Save lives!

In 2017, the Committee received the Prevention Services Community Connection Award from Calvert County Health Department.

TOWN COSTS

- ~\$3000 provided by towns
 - Advertising and photocopying, awareness road sign, web fees, event giveaways (candy, wrist bands, flyers)
- > 400 volunteer hours

Next Steps

- Continue hosting community forums, naloxone training, and drug take-backs
- Continue outreach through community events
 - Engage more businesses to become "Drug-Free" employers
 - Engage more churches
- Explore new outreach events and activities
 - Documentary film on opioid crisis in Twin Beaches "The Ultimate Loss"
 - Concert to raise awareness of opioid crisis (2019)
 - Committee newsletter
