In July of 2018, the Sheriff's Office handled 327 calls for service in Chesapeake Beach. This is up from 308 calls in June 2018.

<u>Water leak</u>-We have repaired 2 water main breaks since my last report. One on the North side of 260 at the eastern most traffic island. We also repaired a fire hydrant struck by a car on Cox Road.

<u>Wet wells-</u> We are preforming a PM at Mears Ave pump station, we have noticed on our SCADA system that the pump starts have increased on pump 3 and we will need to assess why. We are also working to try and keep all of the vegetation growth from taking over all of our wet well fences.

<u>Water meter/MXU</u>- We are getting to the point where the Town will start moving forward with the planned tower radio read system. We continue to change out MXU's.

<u>Flushing</u>- We have completed our 2<sup>nd</sup> flushing for this calendar year. The next one will be in November. Look for signs and sign up for Town Eblast to stay informed.

<u>Ball fields</u> – We are moving forward with the gate and hinge repairs to the perimeter fence. We are currently dealing with the football field maintenance. The roof is now over our dumpster site and this project should be complete at the time of this meeting.

<u>Rail Way Trail</u> – All of the oysters have been relocated to the reef on the bay. I want to personally thank everyone who came out to help with this effort. Thank You!! We are cutting grass and pulling down vines and such all along the trail.

<u>Water park</u> – The Water Park Manager, Town Administrator and I are working on getting a schedule together to start planned maintenance as soon as possible when the park closes for the season.

<u>SHA bridge-</u> The new street lights are up on the bridge and should be working at this time. They are still owned and maintained by SHA until this project is complete. This project at this point is still on schedule.



<u>Emergency calls</u> –We had 9 calls since our last Council Meeting. 5 required a response. 2 were for water main breaks, 1 for a car that hit our fire hydrant and 2 for sewer back ups that were on the home owners' side.

### TOWN OF CHESAPEAKE BEACH Engineering Report

### NEW BUSINESS

### Fishing Creek Bridge (MD Route 261) -

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: The valve vault for the Mears Avenue pump station is completed. The next phase of major utility work will commence with construction of the southbound lane. We have designed a relocation of the 4" Force main from the waterpark to go thru the existing gravity sewer line to avoid existing utility conflicts. The SHA and the utility contractor have installed the new sewer line and it is operating.

### Fishing Creek Dredging -

<u>August, 2018 Update:</u> We have prepared a new permit application to maintain the remaining drainage swale up to the Kellams Field Pond. We have also prepared plans to move a portion of the existing spoil material on-site with a new grading permit. This plan has now been approved by Calvert County. We are now removing approximately 14,000 CY of material within the spoil facility. This could get up to approximately ½ of the facility ready for federal dredge. The contractor is Bourne Environmental. Much of the facility grading is complete and the perimeter roads and being graded next. All work should be complete by the end of September.

The Corps of Engineers has acknowledged the need for a future dredge and will be seeking to get it in the FY19 budget cycle. They have put in motion a proposal to budget a "work plan" or preliminary engineering design phase of the project and will provide the Town with anticipated receiving volumes needed for the Town spoil facility. I also visited two local spoil receiving facilities to engage them in our need to remove and deliver material to them. Once federal funding is appropriated (Approx. \$250,000 for Engineering and \$2 million for Construction Dredging) the project should go thru 1 year of final engineering design to permit for an anticipated construction start of (Fall 2020). I have requested a new channel survey from DNR. They will be performing the survey this month.

### Kellams Marina –

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: We have received the permit approval from MDE to improve the two existing boat ramps (west side of marina west). We will proceed to get the pier reconstruction building permit from Calvert County and apply for DNR funding in the next fiscal year process. We met with DNR this month at the site to review the project for future funding. We are in the process of applying for DNR Grant funding.

### **Richfield Station** –

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: The State Highway Administration provided their findings at a meeting held at Town Hall on May 3, 2018, the findings outline the need for a light on both the east

bound and west bound intersections of Harrison Boulevard and Limerick Lanes. At Maryland Route 260, the light will be installed sometime in the next two years. (No new update)

### WRTP --

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: We are still in the ENR testing period. The final use and occupancy approval and permit closeout from Calvert County has been obtained. We continue to coordinate with the contractor (Bearing) and consultant (WRA) for the project closure and testing procedures. We continue to work thru as is on warranty items with the Contractor and with MDE on final project cost and accounting items. Bid proposals on the lab have been obtained and work is underway. (No new update).

### 261 Sidewalk -

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: We are working on the sidewalk design RFP with Holly and hope to have approval from the State to go put out the Engineering Design Services RFP soon. Letters of interest package from 4 engineering design firms were received. We have obtained formal bids from four firms. A recommendation for bid award will be provided to the state for approval.

### Heritage -

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: Site work (grading) is continuing. Ongoing meetings are being held with the contractor and owner to ensure the town staff is engaged thru the grading and construction process. Mass grading continues as weather has improved. We expect utility installations to begin as soon as shop drawings & material review request have been forwarded to the town.

### B Street Slope Failures & Boardwalk Closure -

<u>August, 2018 Update:</u> Over the past several weeks we have been working with town staff and Geotech Consultant (Hillis-Carnes) to set fourth recommendations on how to move forward to help protect the slope from further degradation and failures, to assist with utility (sewer) relocation measures, to set property line boundaries, and prepare an ordinance for future development within this area. We have set the property lines along the slope, and have obtained updated topography and aerial topography. We are designing the relocated sewer line in 'B' Street and will be meeting with individual lot owners in the coming weeks to discuss structure and stormwater impacts and the existing slope.

### Water and Sewer Manual –

<u>August, 2018 Update</u>: We are working with town staff and Councilman Jaworski on the update of the 1985 water and sewer manual. (On going)

### OLD BUSINESS

Kellams Field – We have received design parameters from American Irrigation to determine the connection needs (pressure & volumes) for the purple pipe. This work can be performed in conjunction with the WWTP upgrades after final completion and acceptance of the facility. (No new update).





### Water Park Report Marilyn VanWagner, General Manager Water Park August 16, 2018

<u>Water Park Closures Cause a Challenging Season</u> – In the beginning of the season the park was closed for six days due to a broken pipe. In addition to these emergency repairs, the park has had the rainiest season in ten years causing the park to be closed an additional eleven days. Many Private Parties, Birthday Parties and Special Events had to be canceled and were unable to be rescheduled.

<u>**Our Park is Safe**</u> – Safety is always our #1 priority and we are proud of our Aquatics Team! This summer we received the score of EXCEEDS on <u>all three</u> of our Unannounced Operational Audits, qualifying us again to receive the Platinum Award! Presented in three levels – Silver, Gold and Platinum – only the top 10% of Jeff Ellis & Associates clients in the world receive a Platinum International Aquatic Safety Award each year. The Chesapeake Beach Water Park is one of 600 Clients and 400,000 lifeguards that are consulted and audited on a regular basis by Ellis and Associates, a leading company in International Aquatics Safety Award. International Aquatics Safety Awards are based on the results of multiple random Unannounced Aquatics Facility Operational Audits throughout the Season. These audits include undercover video surveillance of individual lifeguards while they protect their Zone of Protection areas. In addition individual and team basic life support and rescue skills are evaluated, along with simulated emergencies that measure the effectiveness of established Emergency Action Plans.

**Interviews** – We are now conducting interviews for Supervisors in all departments for the 2019 Season. To interview for a supervisory position an employee must be recommended by two of their immediate supervisors. Final interviews will take place during the Thanksgiving break. This will allow time for all new supervisors to be properly trained and certified over the winter.

<u>Season Ends Soon –</u> The 2018 Season is coming to a close. Our last day of operation, weather permitting, is Monday, September 3.

**Maintenance-** This summer we invited Mark Wilkinson, the President of Paddock Pools located in Rockville, MD, to visit our park. Mark was also President when Paddock built the Water Park back in 1995. Mark brought a team of men down to explore under the park and check out the condition of our piping, brackets, etc. In an effort to be proactive, he is currently working on a report and will give us recommendations on any corrective action we might want to take to extend the life of the infrastructure underneath the Main Pool before we resurface the pool plaster. We expect to have this report back by mid-August.

Closing out the 2018 Water Park Season – As the Season closes we are:

- finalizing estimates for pool concrete repair, concrete decking repair and electrical repair to be presented to council.
- deep cleaning the park.
- prioritizing the maintenance items in preparation for Mayor and Council.
- Working with Marti Gilpin, Town Special Event Coordinator, to plan the 2018 Halloween Family Fun Day
- Planning the 2019 Season to make it the best Season Ever!

On July 13, an MDE inspector arrived at the plant for a complete inspection of the Plant Operation, including all records of lab tests and Storm Water Programs. The inspection passed with just a few minor changes to make on testing procedures.

The Krone flow representative was here on July 20, 2018. He met with plant staff, the contractor, and electrician who are replacing the effluent flow meter. The rep went over all install procedures along with all electrical work needed to certify the operation and calibration of the flow meter.

The plant received 12" of rain from July 21 to July 25. This was one of the highest amounts of rain in that amount of time the upgraded plant has handled. Plant staff was able to control the flow and avoid any spills.

WM Davis will begin the lab remodel on July 31, 2018. Plant staff performed the lab demolition work and hope the project will be finished by Dec 2018.

After the heavy rains on the week of July 21<sup>st</sup>, it was discovered that the electric manhole vaults at the plant were full of rain water. Plant staff pumped out the manhole vaults and will install manhole inserts to stop all water getting into vaults.

Plant staff are continuing to work on spare parts inventory along with finding vendors for pricing on spare parts. Staff is also working on SOP's for all new ENR equipment.

There were no incidents to report in the plant's Solids and Handling Operation or the Lab Sampling Operation with Old Line Hauling and Chesapeake Labs. The new hauling contract will take effect on June 30, 2018 with Old Line Inc.

Plant operations used the Shell Fish Tank to divert flow twice due to rain and heavy flows. The two incidents were on July 21<sup>st</sup> and July 24<sup>th</sup>.

The plant had five alarm calls for this report period. July 20<sup>th</sup> DS was in at 9:20 PM due to a power outage. The generator was on when he arrived. All alarms and equipment were reset and the generator cut off; the plant went back to normal. July 21<sup>st</sup> BW and JC came in at 5:30 PM for influent pump #1 alarm due to high flow. The pump was reset and split flow to the SPT was started. July 22: DS came in at 6 PM to check on plant due to high rainfall (2.52"). He turned the air and mixers off to the plant and discovered that the bar screen was not working because it had rainwater in the control panel. Everything else was normal. July 24 DS came into the plant at 8 PM for an alarm for low head pressure on the blower. He reset the blower and the mixers and the plant was back to normal. July 28 JD in for high level filters #1 and #3 due to high flows. He manually backwashed both to return plant to normal.



The Wastewater Treatment Plant had no spills to report for this August report.

### Future Projects:

To complete the ENR Upgrade Construction. The projects noted in the Capital Projects request are also in progress to be completed within the completion date or within two years after the ENR Upgrade.

### I. B Street Slope:

### Status:

- The south end of the boardwalk remains closed from 14<sup>th</sup> and B street to 11<sup>th</sup> and B street, or the B street entrance to Bayfront Park;
- The Town has conducted a lot line survey, updated topo and Aerial imagery;
- The Town expects the Geotechnical review of the slope to be completed by August 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Each homeowner should take initiative in correcting issues with stormwater runoff from their property onto the slope;
- All homeowners within the impacted area have received door hangers requesting that they schedule to meet with Public Works and our Town Engineer to review each private property current handling of stormwater runoff. The goal of the meetings is to determine if there is anything the private property owner of the Town can due to reduce negative impacts to the slope.
- The Town continues to hold stop work orders with the following conditions;

### Conditions on reinstatement of the zoning permit include;

(1) The permit holder is required to submit a geotechnical report from a professional geotechnical engineer consisting of at least (2) two borings and a global stability analysis with satisfactory results. The report and its findings will be reviewed by an independent 3rd party engineer retained by the Town and must be found by our engineer to be acceptable. Review of private property owners geotechnical review documentation is expected to take place around September 7<sup>th</sup>, once the Towns geotechnical engineer has completed the global study and has had time to review each individual property where work is being held.

(2) The site plan will be technically reviewed with special focus on the distribution and flow of stormwater through the lot and the grading. The Town will conduct this review with the Calvert County Departments of Public Works, Soil Conservation Service, and Inspections and Permits, as the regulatory agencies that address stormwater management and grading approvals. The Town will expedite this review so that your geotechnical engineer is certain to have the benefit of having a site plan certified through this process.



Town Administrators Report – August 2018

- The Town is seeking the move of the sewer line along the coastline within the impacted area of B Street.
- The Town is currently seeking a grant from CBDG (Community Development Block Grant) emergency funds, requesting funds from MDE and coordinating with DNR. Residents that will be served by the new sewer line will be required to complete a survey for grant eligibility. <u>Residents</u> <u>have been provided this survey and are asked to please complete it to assist the Town in leveraging</u> <u>funds to make further improvements.</u>

### IV. Coordination with local, State and Federal government:

• **FEMA emergency response training**: This month the Town Administrator attended an emergency management training at the Prince Georges County Office of Emergency Management. The training focused on how local governments can utilize FEMAs technical tools to make assessments in times of substantial damage. The National Flood Insurance Program was also discussed in detail.

### V. Grants:

- Maryland's Community Parks & Playgrounds Program FY2020: The Town is in the process of applying for a grant to fund renovations at the Kellam's field playground to include new surfacing, replacement of features and an addition of a senior playground concept, which was included in the Counties Program Open Space plan. - **DNR Waterway Improvement Fund Grant FY2020:** The Town is applying for DNR funds to complete repairs to the 6 public boat ramps and dredge funding. **AUGUST 2018 SUBMISSION**

### <u>Chesapeake Beach Oyster Cultivation Society Report</u> August 16, 2018 Chesapeake Beach Town Council Meeting

July 28 - 10 AM Oyster transfer from Fishing Creek to Old Rock Reef was a great success, 61 CBOCS volunteers, Huntington boy scouts and others from surrounding towns joined the Chesapeake Beach public works department to move 100,000 oyster shells. Many thanks to Bobby Abner for the use of his boat yard and loading ramp. Due to a change in the housing of the oysters in the creek we found an increase in survivability to over 90 percent. We will test this method in future years to determine if other factors were involved.

August 11 – 9 AM CBOCS volunteers made reef balls at the Chesapeake Village Water Tower. These reef balls will be used to identify the expanded Oyster bed on the Old Rock Reef in the Bay. Additional manufacturing will occur on August 18 and 25. At 9 AM. This is a rain or shine event as we work in the storage shed. If not raining we will also be power washing the oyster cages from Fishing Creek.

August 8 Ron Draper and I gave an oyster presentation to 12 children, and some parents at the Twin Beaches Library. We were able to show the oyster cycle from larvae to 15 year old oysters at one station. At the other station we demonstrated the value of oysters cleaning up the water, we also showed a number of critters that lived in the oyster reef. Chesapeake Beach Railway Trail Nature Bingo games were distribute to all children and they were encourage to bring their completed observations to the library for display.

September 22 - 10 AM will be the start of the 8<sup>th</sup> cycle of oyster growing in Fishing Creek. At this time we will be depositing 100,000 oyster shells into the large rotating cages and moving them to the 3<sup>rd</sup> rest stop for a 10 month stay. Volunteers are necessary to do this and should to wear water shoes. You will get wet. Loading of cages and counting of spat will take place at Marina West behind the Waterpark.

October and November will bring the annual field trips of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade students from 8 Calvert County elementary schools.

The Route 261 Bridge Railings will be installed on the walkway before the Trail. A presentation was made at the Chesapeake Beach Planning and Zoning meeting on August 8. Their reaction was positive. The next step is to obtain a construction permit from Calvert County.
