Inside this issue you will find information on the new Adolescent Clubhouse in Lusby, MD, information on 2 new support groups being offered in Calvert County, and a special thank you to our First Responders in the Spotlight section.

Highlight Story

The LBHA has partnered with East-John Youth Center to develop and implement a grant funded Adolescent Clubhouse in Lusby, MD. An Adolescent Clubhouse is designed to serve youth ages 12-17 (<18 and still in high school) and their families who need recovery support services. The Adolescent Clubhouse is a non-clinical program focused on providing appropriate evidence-based programming related to drug and alcohol-free lifestyle to its adolescent participants. Under the SOR grant, primary focus will be placed on participants at risk of, or diagnosed with, opioid use disorder (OUD).

The Adolescent Clubhouse will tentatively begin operating on May 1, 2021, following strict COVID-19 guidelines, combining both in-person and virtual services. The recovery-oriented services for the Adolescent Clubhouse participants and their families include, but are not limited to:

- Evidence-based screening
- Substance use groups
- Recovery goal planning
- Educational and vocational support
- Recreational events
- Youth and family driven activities
- o Evidence-based group sessions for families

In conjunction with East John Youth Center, the Maryland Coalition of Families has employed a Family Peer Support Specialist that will provide services to the families of the Adolescent Clubhouse members. Barstow Acres Children Center will be offering webinars and virtual trainings to children, families, and behavioral health professionals in Calvert County.

Resource Highlight

The LBHA has developed 2 new support groups for Calvert County residents. One of the LBHA FY2021 goals was to increase awareness of the importance of effective treatment for behavioral health disorders within Calvert County. Our strategies included developing a support group for populations that have a lack of support within our county.

The LBHA collaborated with the Calvert Rainbow Alliance to develop a support group for the LGBTQ+ community. This support group named "I AM" is offered virtually for the time being, due to COVID-19 restrictions. The "I AM" group meets every 4th Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm and is offered to any adult Calvert County resident that identifies as LGBTQ+ or is an advocate for supporting this community.

The LBHA has also worked with high-school aged volunteers to develop a mental health support group for youth. This group "AWWA-Accepting Who We Are" meets virtually every 4th Friday of the month at 5:00pm. AWWA is offered to any high-school aged individual that is looking for support on issues related to mental health. There are 2 adult volunteers that will attend each meeting to offer support. One of the adults is a licensed clinical professional and the other adult will act as a peer support for the group.

Once the COVID-19 restrictions are lifted and it is deemed safe to return to in-person services, both groups have physical locations to host these meetings. Updates regarding the transition to in-person meetings and the potential to offer these meetings more than once a month will be posted by the LBHA.
