
- Official Town of Chesapeake Beach 2020 Election:

 - Town Hall October 17, 24, and 31 from 9AM-12PM.
 - Residents can fill out an absentee ballot application and/or pick up their absentee ballot from a Board member.

COVID Safety Outside Town Hall on 3 November 2020

- Each Candidate has been assigned a space with tent (~10'x10') & Table.
 - Board assigned spaces by drawing.
- Candidate will only electioneer from within their assigned space.
- Candidate shall wear face mask.
- Candidate shall stay near center 4' area of their 10' wide tent and behind their table to assist in keeping safe separation from both voters and other candidates.
- Candidates may provide handout if voter wishes to accept.



November 3rd, 2020 Election Day Layout Map




Inside Polling Place COVID Safety

- Everyone must wear a mask in Polling Room
- Voters will use our new touchless hand sanitizer dispenser as they enter
- Room is set up for 6-feet separation
- Registration Judges are behind separation shield
- Election Board will monitor, and limit number of people inside polling room as needed to maintain safe separation.

Instructions to Absentee Voter (Steps 1 – 3)

Your voter packet contains 3 items: ballot plus oath envelope and return envelope


Step #1: Mark Ballot.



- Once marked, do not cross out or erase; it may invalidate the ballot.
- Vote for only **one** Mayor Candidate
- Vote for no more than six Town Council Candidates
- Vote Yes or No for each question

Step #2: Re-fold Ballot and Insert Into Oath Envelope and Seal.

Insert only one ballot per Oath envelope. Envelope must be sealed. Multiple ballots in Oath envelope will invalidate all ballots.



Instructions to Absentee Voter (Cont'd)(Step 4 & 5)



Step #5: Return Ballot to Board of Elections (Town Hall) prior to closing of polls on Election Day (8:00 p.m.)

- a. Insert into Drop Box outside Town Hall, or
- **b. Drop off at Town Hall** during "Saturday Ballot Pickup" on October 17th, 24th and 31st from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.
- c. Mail (no postage necessary if mailed in the U.S.).

Note: Mailed ballots received/delivered at Town Hall <u>after</u> close of polls, even if post marked on or before November 3rd 2020 will <u>not</u> be counted.



Vote in Person Option. Bring the ballot with you on election day, check in, receive a Voter Authority Card (VAC), follow Judge's direction to scan station and insert ballot into scanner.
